

**Theodor Kockelkoren**  
**Executive Board and Chair of the Organisation for Economic Cooperation and Development Task Force on Financial Consumer Protection, Netherlands Authority for Financial Markets (AFM)**

Theodor Kockelkoren joined the AFM in April 2002. He has been a member of the AFM Executive Board since 2008. His portfolio comprised supervision of banks, insurance companies, asset managers and intermediaries. This included offering, mediating in and providing advice about saving, borrowing, insuring and investing.

Recently, Theodor Kockelkoren has announced he would lay down his statutory duties and leave the AFM per 15 October 2015. He will not be involved in the supervision of financial institutions. However, until October 15th he will continue with his chairmanship of the G20/OECD Task Force on Financial Consumer Protection and his chairmanship of the IOSCO Committee on Emerging Risk on behalf of the AFM. He will also continue to be involved in several projects within the AFM aiming to further develop the IT organization.

Prior to working for the AFM, Mr. Kockelkoren spent seven years at McKinsey & Company, where he focused on the energy, financial services and telecommunication industries. In his last role, as Associate Principle, he was responsible for the provision of advice to a number of clients in the aforementioned industries.

Mr. Kockelkoren obtained an MBA from INSEAD in Fontainebleau (France) and studied Electrical Engineering at the Eindhoven Technical University. Mr. Kockelkoren is married and has two daughters and two sons.
