

## Jaime González Aguadé President - Comisión Nacional Bancaria y de Valores México

On December 14, 2012 he assumed the presidency of the National Banking and Securities Commission (CNBV), after being appointed by Enrique Peña Nieto, President of Mexico, as proposed by the Minister of Finance and Public Debt, Luis Videgaray.

Jaime González Aguadé has a degree in Economics from the Instituto Tecnológico Autónomo de México (ITAM), and holds a Master degree in Public and Private Management with Specialization on Finance from Yale University.

His public sector experience includes being appointed by President Felipe Calderon, in June 2012, as General Director of the Federal Electricity Commission (CFE).

Previously, he was Under- Secretary of Electricity at the Ministry of Energy, where he was responsible for the planning and design of the energy policy.

Previously, he was General Director of BANSEFI, where he accomplished a deeper penetration of financial services to lower-income population through "L@ Red de la Gente", which was a commercial alliance between the Popular Savings and Credit sector and BANSEFI.

Also, he served as Deputy General Director Program and Operation in Financiera Rural and Deputy Director of Regional Banking of Nacional de Credito Rural S.N.C, where he was in charge of the operational regularization of BANRURAL's system.

He also served as General Director of Administration and Control of Institutional Programs, at the Institute for the Protection of Bank Savings (IAPB), where he was in charge of the financial restructuring program and the sale process of Grupo Financiero Serfin, S.A de C.V., as well as responsible for the sale of the shareholding of Banca Serfin, SA.
